


Alternative 7 Habitats:

- Ground Nesting (7 acres)
- Marsh (10.3 acres)
- Shrub Nesting (36 acres)

Total (53.3 acres)

\$41 million

Total Project Cost



Terrebonne HNC Island Restoration



Alternative 7a

Habitats:

- Ground Nesting (4 acres)
- Marsh (10.5 acres)
- Shrub Nesting (27 acres)

Total (41.4 acres)

\$34 million

Total Project Cost



Terrebonne HNC Island Restoration



Anticipated benefits:

Restore up to 50 acres of nesting and brood-rearing habitat for:

- Terns and Skimmers
- Herons
- Egrets
- Brown Pelicans
- Clapper rails



